# ACC Reminders

The Whisperwoods Architectural Control Committee is primarily tasked with the management and approval or disapproval of new construction and changes to existing properties. The work of your ACC preserves property values through the vigorous enforcement of our neighborhood covenants; a copy of which is available at [MyWhisperwoods.com](http://MyWhisperwoods.com).

**Any exterior change to any home or lot within Whisperwoods must be approved by the ACC.**

- ACC Request Forms and committee contact information is available at the web site.
- Our covenants require that no tree in excess of 6" caliper may be removed from any property without ACC approval. All home sites were originally equipped with two trees in each front yard and in the case of corner lots, at least one additional tree on the second street facing side. If your home is not so equipped, please consider the replacement of the missing trees as soon as possible. Replacement trees need only be 4" caliper. Placement must be consistent with neighboring properties.
- Please examine your home and lot to ensure any shutters are properly fixed in position and that any painted surfaces in need of fresh paint receive proper attention. Color changes require ACC approval.
- All residents are additionally asked to ensure lawn weeds are aggressively managed.

Our neighborhood remains one of Collierville's most desirable and as property values steadily recover your BOD and ACC wish to encourage everyone to comply with our covenants to the benefit of all.

## Crape Myrtle Bark Scale!!!

A new scale pest was introduced to the Memphis area in 2012.

Unfortunately, it has found it's way to Collierville  
...and also to Whisperwoods.

This insect causes a severe loss of nutrients, less brilliant blooms, and possibly no blooms on the affected tree.

If left untreated, it can kill the tree.

A common sign of your tree having this scale is a black moldy residue on the tree's bark; this is waste that the scale deposits on the tree.

Your tree can return to full health and beauty if treated with a systemic insecticide.

Treatment can be accomplished using a tree service company or done by the homeowner with products sold in stores.

The Crape Myrtles in Whisperwoods common areas were treated this past Fall.

Please check your Crape Myrtles and treat them if needed as this can eventually kill your tree and spread to others.
